





Changing Trends - Enrollment Unaffected (and Sometimes Improved) in Recessions








Inventory Growth Slowing in University Owned Properties








University Owned –Pace of Cost Increases Slowing







- > 2/3 of Undergrads work while in school








Student Housing - Newer Units Less Likely to Have Double Occupancy










Student Housing Sample – Converting Estimated Beds to Units



Rental Housing Stock 2018














Student Housing – Larger Unit Mix Increases Size Over Time

Average Size by Decade











Percent Undergraduates with Disabilities






Rent and Occupancy by Decade Built









Change in Vacancy & Rent by Region















