

Daniel Hornung, Special Assistant to the President for Economic Policy. Daniel Hornung serves as Special Assistant to the President for Economic Policy at the National Economic Council (NEC). In this role, he coordinated efforts within the NEC to develop and secure passage of the American Rescue Plan and the Inflation Reduction Act. He leads macroeconomic analysis and policy development. And he oversees housing policy across the Administration, including development and implementation of the Administration's Housing Supply Action Plan.

Before the NEC, Hornung served as a judicial law clerk to Judge Merrick Garland on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit. During the Obama-Biden Administration,

Hornung served as Special Assistant to the President and Senior Policy Advisor, focused on climate policy, economic policy, and judicial nominations. Prior to that, he worked in the Office of Management and Budget. A native of Chicago, Hornung has also been a fellow at Chicago CRED, an organization focused on increasing economic opportunity in Chicago neighborhoods.

Hornung holds a J.D. from Yale Law School and a B.A. in economics and political science from Yale College.
