Tax reform legislation enacted in 2017 represents the most sweeping overhaul to the nation's tax laws since 1986. Of particular significance to the multifamily industry are a new Opportunity Zones tax incentive designed to drive investment in economically distressed areas and a 20 percent deduction for qualified pass-through income. With the Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service having proposed implementing regulations in these areas, this session will dive into the details on how the new tax law will impact the multifamily industry.

As most of this development is greenfield, the developer was able to innovate around multiple areas that impact traditional mixed-use development including telecom, security, utility management/IoT, parking, 3<sup>rd</sup>-party partnerships and construction techniques. Michael Allen, Director of Quintain's Build to Rent group, will discuss their plans in these areas and how this is expected to add NOI and enhance the customer experience. Karen Hollinger, Vice President of Corporate Initiatives for AvalonBay, will moderate this session and compare and contrast to how these mega-trends could impact more traditional multifamily development in the US.
