NMHC/NAA will soon file comments with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) raising concerns about the conflicts between the agency's Final Rule on Disparate Impact and the Supreme Court's decision in <u>Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs v.</u> <u>Inclusive Communities Project, Inc. (Inclusive Communities)</u>. NMHC/NAA have long-argued that numerous HUD regulations and guidance documents reinforce an interpretation of disparate impact that conflicts with recent legal precedent and creates uncertainty in housing providers use of long-held, business practices.

OPPORTUNITY ZONES <u>NMHC/NAA Meet with Treasury on Opportunity Zones</u>



NMHC/NAA on July 26 met with Treasury Department officials to provide the multifamily industry's recommendations for implementing Opportunity Zones. <u>As previously reported</u>, this program was enacted as part of last December's *Tax Cuts and Jobs Act* and provides a strong incentive to drive considerable investment in multifamily housing. Specifically, it allows for the deferral of capital gains invested in Opportunity Funds and eliminates tax on certain gains realized from Opportunity Fund

investments.

Banking Regulators Issue Guidance on the Implementation of HVCRE



Banking regulators <u>issued interim guidance</u> on the treatment of High Volatility Commercial Real Estate (HVCRE) loans on July 6. <u>As previously</u> <u>reported</u>, S.2155 *Economic Growth, Regulatory Relief, and Consumer Protection Act* (*EGRRCPA*) was signed into law on May 24, 2018 and included language modifying regulatory rules pertaining to HVCRE loans.
